Would you want to visit Russia? Would you want to see the most famous, interesting and traditional Russia in only one day? If your answer is YES, you should read my recommendations because nobody loves my country as I love it.

First of all, you should fly to Moscow because that city, recognized as a world city, is the capital and a major cultural and religious center of Russia. Directly from the airport, you ought to wind your way to Red Square, for it is the most famous city square in Moscow. It is also the geometric center of the city where you will see the official residence of the President of Russia, the Kremlin, and Saint Basil's Cathedral. The cathedral's design, shaped as a flame of a bonfire rising into the sky, is so beautiful that according to myth its architects were blinded, so they couldn't have built the same cathedral anywhere else. Thus, if you visit Red Square first, you can see many interesting things in just one time.

Secondly, you should go to Arbat Street. It is such a long and interesting pedestrian street that you can spend a lot of time there. Many famous artists and academics live there. Vakhtangov Theatre, which was founded in 1921, is also located there. Right on this street are many singers and guitar players whom you can listen to. Therefore, Arbat Street is known as the cultural street. There are also a number of small shops where you can buy Russian souvenirs, such as *Matryoshka* dolls, samovars for heating water, *ushanka* warm hats, and other stuff. By that time, you might be hungry, so stay on the Arbat Street, where are many restaurants, even the Hard Rock Café. Nevertheless, my advice is to go to the Russian restaurants to taste some traditional Russian food, like *pelmeni*, borsch, Russian vodka with caviar, honey, *blini* and others. Hence, Arbat is the pleasure place, where you can immerse yourself in Russian life.

At the end of your Russian day, you ought to go to a traditional Russian steam bath, *banya*. Russian *banyas* usually have three rooms: a steam room, a washing room, and an entrance room. Russians love really hot *banyas*, so the temperature in a steam room is about 110 degrees Celsius (230 degrees Fahrenheit). Don't forget to use a felt hat to keep the head as cold as possible. She has a unique ability to revive the sense of faith within our hearts. She was especially perfect in her conduct with her family. Her best time, words, and activities had been given to her family. Unfortunately, I lost this loyal friend and spiritual teacher. While I was in America, she died in tragic car accident.
